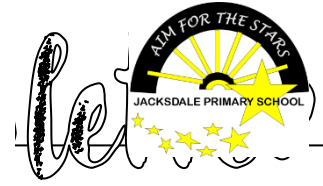




Year 3



WELCOME TO YEAR 3:

We are so excited to begin the new academic year with you. Here is some important information that will help our term to run as smoothly as possible.

Mrs March teaches Year 3 on Monday, Tuesdays and alternate Wednesdays, Mrs Manton teaches alternate Wednesdays, Thursday and Fridays. Mrs Pell is our Teaching Assistant.

What are we up to?

English

We will be starting the term by studying the book 'Stone Age boy' by Satoshi Kitamura which will link with our History unit. We will teach a new spelling pattern each week from the Spelling Shed scheme with a test on a Friday, The children are able to practise their spellings online at home and we will send the details of this home in the next few weeks. In guided reading we will be reading 'Voice in the Park' by Anthony Browne.

Maths

We follow the White Rose scheme for maths and our first unit will be on place value, followed by work on addition and subtraction. Children will be able to access Times Table Rock Stars at home and will have their log in details shortly.

Topic

We're very excited to start our new history based topic 'Stone Age to Iron Age.' This links perfectly with our Science unit on rocks and we will be sending details home soon about a trip to the National Stone Centre. In Art we will be exploring and recreating cave paintings. This half term we will be exploring relationships in PE and learning how to greet people in French. Our first unit in computing will be on coding on Purple Mash.

UNIFORM & P.E. KIT

Please ensure that the children are wearing correct school uniform and this is labelled with their name – particularly jumpers, cardigans and coats! We understand that there are times where exceptions need to be made but please make us aware of this.

This term the children will be doing P.E. every **Tuesday (Outdoor) and Thursday (Indoor)**.

Please make sure your child arrives at school wearing their PE kit, which includes:

White plain t-shirt

Navy / Black / dark plain shorts or tracksuit bottoms

Navy jumper (especially in the cold weather!)

Plimsolls or trainers

It is very important that children are suitably dressed for PE sessions as they are at risk of hurting themselves or another child, especially if they do not have the correct footwear. Please remind your child that they need to remove all jewellery (including earrings) and long hair should be tied back for these lessons.

HOMEWORK

Reading is such an important life skill, and it is essential that the children are reading regularly at home. This could include their school reading books, magazines, websites – anything at all!

We know that weekday evenings are busy, but please try to ensure that the children read at least 3 times a week with an adult at home and this is recorded in their reading planner. We check these every week and award green stamps when this has been completed.

We know the children really enjoy learning using tablets and phones – technology is the future! Online activities are available for the child to practise times tables and spellings and we would really appreciate your support with this as it consolidates and supports the learning we do in the classroom. We have weekly leaderboards and certificates as an incentive for completing these activities.

The children will receive passwords for all of the online activities available to them in the first few weeks and these will be stuck in to their reading diaries.
